

INDONESIA

Why we build: As of 2022, the government estimated the housing backlog was 12.71 million units. People also must face poor sanitation and unclean water, and health problems, especially for mothers and babies. Habitat aims to galvanize resources to help more than 40,000 families improve their housing conditions and provide access to housing in the next two years.

Project description: Volunteers will assist selected families to build new 300 sq ft permanent house with private bedroom and toilet. Typical volunteer tasks will include: bending and wiring rebar, mixing mortar and concrete, laying bricks, and building walls. Some teams may participate in digging of foundations and septic tanks.





Batam

What to expect: Volunteers arrive at Batam Centre, Harbour Bay International Ferry Terminal if arriving through Singapore, or Hang Nadim International Airport from Soekarno-Hatta International Airport. From there, volunteers are transported to their local hotel for the week. During a week build, teams travel 30 minutes each weekday to the worksite.



Kulon Progo, Yogyakarta

What to expect: Volunteers arrive at Yogyakarta International Airport. Hotel accommodation and transport will be provided for a week build schedule. It takes 75 minutes to go to the build site. Social Learning Activity to be done with the community members with various activities, such as learning and discussion with PASSA Group or supporting local enterprise.

49,510 families are still living in poverty.



Mauk, Tangerang

What to expect: Volunteers arrive at Soekarno-Hatta International Airport. Hotel accommodation and transportation will be provided for a week build schedule. It takes 90 minutes to go to build site. Social Learning Activity will be done with the community members with various activity, such as learning and discussion with PASSA Group.

1,215 families or 44% of Tuksono Village, Kulon Progo district, are still living in poverty. 409 of them stay in unhealthy housing conditions.
